LEASE

This LEASE (hereinafter "Lease") is executed this ____ day of ____ 2012 by and between the TOWN OF NORTHBRIDGE, acting by and through its Board of Selectmen (hereinafter referred to as the "TOWN"), and OLIVER ASHTON POST #343, INC., a Massachusetts non-profit corporation and a post of the American Legion, with an address of 198 Church Avenue, Northbridge, Massachusetts 01534 ("LESSOR").

Pursuant to an Indenture between the LESSOR and the Trustees of the Rockdale Village Foundation dated August 21, 1956 and recorded with the Worcester District Registry of Deeds in Book 3800, Page 51, the LESSOR is the owner of record of a certain parcel of land located in the Town of Northbridge, on Church Avenue, described in said Indenture and shown on Northbridge Assessors' Map 22A as parcel 151, and including a lodge building and a parking lot.

The LESSOR hereby leases to the TOWN all of said land, including the parking lot, except that portion containing the lodge building, said land being shown on a copy of a portion of said Map 22A and an annotated Google Maps aerial photograph attached hereto together as Exhibit A, (the leased area being hereafter referred to as the "Premises"), together with such rights of access and passage to, in, over and through said Premises as are necessary or reasonable in connection with the use described herein and the TOWN's related use of that certain parcel of land known as the Legion Ball Grounds, adjacent to the Premises and indicated on Exhibit A, subject to the following terms and conditions:

I. USE, PURPOSE, TERM

Use of the Premises is specifically authorized by the TOWN, its contractors, agents, representatives, employees, invitees, and licensees, for the purpose of parking of vehicles, preparation and loading and unloading of equipment, viewing space for spectators, similar activities ancillary to the TOWN's use of the said Legion Ball Grounds for athletic and recreational activities, specifically including but not limited to baseball and softball, and Pop Warner football, and the conduct of such athletic and recreational activities on that portion of the Premises which is included within the layout of the fields on the Legion Ball Grounds, by and through the Playgrounds and Recreation Commission, or otherwise.

Such use by the TOWN, its contractors, agents, representatives, employees, invitees, and licensees may be exercised from the date of the execution of this Lease and shall continue until and through June 30, 2013.

II. CONSIDERATION

As consideration for the Lease rights granted hereunder, the TOWN shall use reasonable efforts to maintain the Premises in good repair, including periodic cleaning of that portion included within the layout of said fields on the Legion Ball Grounds so as to protect against accumulation of trash or other debris.

In addition, the TOWN shall provide reasonable maintenance and repairs of the parking lot area.

III. INSURANCE

The TOWN shall maintain public liability insurance, including coverage for bodily injury, wrongful death and property damage, in an amount acceptable to the LESSOR and in an amount sufficient to support the obligations of the TOWN under the terms of this Lease.

IV. CONDUCT

During the term of this Lease, the TOWN shall at all times conduct itself so as not to unreasonably interfere with the operations of the LESSOR, and observe and obey applicable laws and regulations. The TOWN shall obtain the written authorization of the LESSOR prior to the erection of any structure or fixed equipment on the Premises. Any such structure or fixed equipment so erected by the TOWN shall remain the property of the TOWN, and the TOWN shall have the right to remove such structures or equipment upon the termination of this Lease, provided the Premises are restored, as near as possible, to a condition equal to their condition prior to the erection of such structures or equipment.

The TOWN shall not make or suffer any waste of the Premises.

V. TERMINATION

This Lease may be terminated by either party for failure of the other party to comply with its obligations hereunder (a "breach") upon written notice of termination at least ninety (90) days prior to the termination date stated within said notice and failure of the party receiving notice to commence and diligently prosecute a cure of the breach within that period. If the party receiving notice cures said breach within that period, the termination notice shall not be effective and the Lease shall continue in effect. If the breach is such that it may not reasonably be cured within 90 days, the party receiving notice shall have an additional 90 days to effect a cure, provided that it continues to act reasonably and diligently to do so.

Upon termination of the Lease, the TOWN shall quit and deliver up the Premises to the LESSOR peaceably and quietly and in as good order and condition as at the start of the Term, or as put into by the TOWN during the Term, reasonable use and wear thereof, fire and other unavoidable casualties excepted.

VI. MODIFICATIONS and AMENDMENTS

Modifications or amendments to this Lease shall be in writing and duly executed by both parties hereto in order to be effective. The TOWN shall not assign this Lease without the written approval of the LESSOR.

VII. NOTICE

For purposes of this Lease, the parties shall be deemed duly notified in accordance with the terms and provisions hereof, if written notices are mailed to the following addresses:



Participating in this grant provides us with a chance to further this local effort which may not be possible otherwise. As Town Planner I am committed to assist CMRPC on this worthy and timely project proposal.

Questions & Answers

October 10, 2012

1) **Question** - Why do we have to do this?

Answer – It is required by federal law under the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986 (SARA) Title III and the Emergency Planning and Community Response Act (EPCRA).

2) Question - What is the primary purpose of a Local or Regional Emergency Planning Committee?

Answer – Since the requirement comes from the federal hazardous material laws and regulations, its primary function is to track the Tier 2 reports from chemical industries within the town, provide an interface between the town citizens and this information, prepare a hazardous material chemical response plan for the town, oversee training of town responders and officials, and provide public awareness on the preparation efforts. The membership of a REPC is made up of both local officials and industry, particularly those that use chemicals listed as extremely hazardous substances (EHS).

3) Question - Why regionalize?

Answer – Grant funding is being directed to regional entities and strongly dissuaded for sole communities. Also, regionalizing shares the burden of maintaining an operational emergency planning committee because the member towns can share filling the seven membership categories (Fire, Police, Health, EMS, Emergency Management, Local CMO, and DPW). IT also shares the expertise from a greater number of chemical industries from the member towns.

4) Question – What towns are participating and why?

Answer – Grafton, Upton, and Northbridge emergency management agencies began discussing pooling resources for a local emergency response committee. Millbury and Sutton both asked to join. Each of the five towns are roughly the same size, with similar town governments, similar emergency services, and a history of working together. All need to develop their own Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) or join a Regional Emergency Planning Committee (REPC).

5) Question – Don't we already have Northbridge Emergency Management Agency (NEMA)?

Answer – Yes, but it serves a different function. NEMA's mission is to coordinate town assets during an emergency event. An LEPC/REPC is focused on pre-event "planning" and training, so has no role in an actual emergency, other than an information resource. Also, NEMA is "all hazard focused" while an LEPC/REPC is solely oil/hazardous material focused.

6) Question - Doesn't Northbridge already have a Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC)?

Answer – No. Northbridge did begin the certification process as a sole community, but that application did not make it to full certification and has since lapsed out of date. If Northbridge chose to start its own LEPC again, it would have to start from the beginning of the process.

7) Question - What benefit will this bring to Northbridge?

Answer – Shared resources, shared responsibility, increased grant funding opportunities.

8) Question – What will it cost Northbridge?

Answer – There will be four specific costs to each town: 1) Each member town will be asked to make a financial contribution to the REPC for operational expenses and to act as a "matching revenue stream" for grants; 2) each town will be responsible to assure representatives of each of the seven disciplines (Fire, Police, Health, EMS, Emergency Management, Local CMO, and DPW) participate – it is up to each town to determine how they compensate these representatives; 3) each town will take turns being the designated fiduciary entity for the REPC with Grafton being the first town.; and 4) each town will be expected to fund and support their emergency responders participating in training and exercises to meet the objectives of the REPC and ultimately federal law and regulations.

9) Question – What actions does Northbridge need to take to advance this process?


Answer – We need Northbridge to do the following three things: 1) Sign the letter designating the Community Emergency Response Coordinator and endorsing participation in the REPC; 2) Direct the town accountant to set up a revolving account for the Blackstone Valley Regional Emergency Planning Committee; and 3) notify Northbridge departments that they will be expected to support and participate in this process.

10) Question – To whom is the REPC accountable?

Answer – A REPC is accountable at three levels: 1) Ultimately, the REPC is accountable to the Chief Municipal Official of each member community; 2) Operationally, the REPC operates by a set of By-Laws with an executive board elected from within the REPC membership; and 3) Administratively, any LEPC/REPC is also responsible to the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) which resides within the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency (MEMA). Since the REPC and local emergency management agency are closely related, it is typical that a representative of the REPC will provide updates to the local emergency management agency at their regular scheduled meetings.


11) Question – Where can we get more information on this process?

Section 10 of the town's rules and regulations governing liquor establishments requires that all managers and employees of liquor establishments be trained in an alcohol intervention program approved by the Chief of Police or his designee.

After comparing alcohol intervention training programs in surrounding communities, it was determined that if any training was mandated the cost and the responsibility of training employees was left to the individual liquor establishments.

The police department investigated several options including online alcohol intervention training programs and identified two programs that would fulfill the requirements of Section 10 of the town's rules and regulations governing liquor establishments:

These two programs provide professional classroom instruction that allow for follow up questions and participation by attendees. I would recommend Alcohol Intervention Methods of Shrewsbury, MA as the cost and program design allows training for both "On Premise and Off Premise" liquor establishments. There is a \$25.00 fee for each participant, who receive a 3 year certification following the completion of the training.

The Town of Northbridge should host an annual Alcohol Intervention Training program for all liquor establishments as this would create a uniform training procedure for our community. The Northbridge Police Department would gladly coordinate this yearly training which would be hosted at the Northbridge Police Department.

The police department has checked with all liquor establishments and has scheduled a training seminar at the Northbridge Police Department on Saturday, January 12, 2013 from 9:00AM to 12:30 PM for approximately 23 participants.

Town Manager Kozak recommends that establishments be given 90 days to comply with the training requirements.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT – NOVEMBER 26, 2012

1) Northbridge Elementary School/Fairy Tale and Fable Parade:

This is an annual event held for the kindergarten students at Northbridge Elementary School. The parade is a chance for the kindergarten students to make and show off their costumes reflecting the theme of a fairy tale or fable.

2) Trinity Episcopal Church/Thank you note to the Dept. of Public Works and Town Manager:

I received a note thanking the DPW and Town Manager for assistance with relocating the state's electronic sign board as well as for assistance with tree trimming.

3) Toys for Kids and Teens Campaign [Bill Audette]:

The annual Toys for Kids and Teens campaign, sponsored by the Marine Corps League, is beginning this week. Donation boxes are located in the Town Hall, Town Hall Annex and various other locations around town.

4) Legislative Breakfast:

The Central Mass. Regional Planning Commission held a legislative breakfast and State Auditor Suzanne Bump was present to discuss local mandates and how cities and towns can challenge laws that they feel are unfunded mandates. Recent challenges include transportation costs for homeless families in shelters, dam safety laws, and permitting of solid waste disposal facilities. Other topics discussed included Chapter 74 [Regional Vocational Schools, Chapter 70 [Anti-bullying requirements for School Departments] and Charter School's requirements.

5) Rededication of the Thomas S. Perron Memorial:

I attended the rededication ceremony, which was held on November 10th at the Honor Roll on Linwood Avenue. The ceremony was conducted by the Trustees of Soldiers' Memorials Committee.

6) 237th U.S. Marine Corps Birthday Celebration:

I attended this celebration, which was held at the Uxbridge VFW Hall on Saturday, November 10, 2012, and Bill Audette was also honored at this event.

7) Visit to Operation Suitcase:

The Police Chief, Fire Chief, and I toured Operation Suitcase. This operation is located upstairs in the shop complex next door to Town Hall. Operation Suitcase is a non-profit program that provides clothing to families in need. Donations can be dropped off at the entrance to Access TCA where the UPS/Fedex boxes are located.
