

Commission for FY'17

Delegates and Alternates are a vital link with your planning commission that enables us to deliver support services, to compete for discretionary grant funds, to identify community needs in transportation and land use and to foster sub-regional cooperation through shared services and procurement. Communities with active delegates and alternates fare better in receiving a return on your investment than those who fail to communicate local needs or to link up with our programs. Representation on CMRPC is weighted by population for each community in the district and your community has the opportunity to receive direct benefits and shape public policy in a real and tangible way through participation in the various sub committees such as Transportation, Physical Development and Legislative Affairs as well as the Executive Committee. In these financially challenging times, it is critical both for the Commission and for your community to maintain this link. Please choose members of your community who will translate the Commission's goals and expertise to your town as well as being a communicator of your town's needs to the Commission.

CMRPC's mission is fourfold: (1) addressing growth and development issues that extend beyond community boundaries, (2) maintaining the district's certification for federal transportation improvement funds, (3) providing technical knowledge and resources to assist local government in addressing specific land use, economic or environmental problems resulting from growth or decline, and (4) building strong working relationships with member communities, state and federal officials as well as the area's legislative representatives. Under the District Local Technical Assistance Program (DLTA), we are providing assistance for sub-regional cooperation and service delivery. On a community planning level, CMRPC has provided direct technical assistance to communities in addition to the ever present regional initiatives. In addition, we have worked with numerous communities to generate GIS maps and data, develop Open Space Plan, develop Master Plan elements and a long list of other projects. Homeland Security programs for our region are administered through CMRPC. We work to bring millions of dollars in grant funds into our member communities every year.

Your community is entitled to three delegates and one alternate. Two delegates are appointed by the Planning Board. The first delegate must be a member of the Planning Board and the third delegate need only be a resident of Northbridge. The Board of Selectmen or Town Manager appoints the second delegate and the alternate. These appointees need only be residents of your community.

According to our records, the current Board of Selectmen's delegate is James Athanas and the alternate is Dan Nolan. During the past fiscal year, neither attended any of the four Quarterly Commission Meetings.

Farley of 401 Cooper Road, Northbridge, MA, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does sell and convey to said Thomas A. and Anne M. Farley, that certain cemetery Lot No. 16, two burial plots, situated on the way called Birch Path South, in the Pine Grove Cemetery, and the sole and exclusive right of burial of the dead therein, subject to the following rules and restrictions for the regulation and government of said Cemetery; viz:

- 1st. That the said Lot shall not be used for any other purpose than as a place of burial for the dead, and proper Cemetery uses, such as the Town may approve; and no trees within the Lot or the Cemetery shall be cut down or destroyed without consent of the Town.

with a princip	oal place of business located at 100 Valley	Parkway, Northbrid	lge, MA.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Sutton owns and operates a public wastewater treatment system for the service of its inhabitants (the "Sutton Sewer System");

WHEREAS, Northbridge owns and operates a public wastewater treatment system for the service of its inhabitants (the "Northbridge Sewer System");

WHEREAS, Walmart has constructed a retail store on certain property in the Town of Northbridge on 100 Valley Parkway, identified as Parcel 119, on Northbridge Assessors' Map 1, and further described as: Walmart (the "Property"), which property is owned by W/S Northbridge LLC, and as part of such development seeks to obtain a connection to a public wastewater treatment system for the purpose of providing for the treatment and disposal of wastewater generated by such development;

WHEREAS, the Northbridge Sewer System does not extend to the Property, and the costs associated with connecting the Property to the Northbridge Sewer System would be significant;

WHEREAS, because of the proximity of the Property to the Town of Sutton and the Sutton Sewer System, connecting the Property to the Sutton Sewer System can be accomplished with less difficulty and at less expense than connecting the Property to the Northbridge Sewer System;

WHEREAS, Sutton and Northbridge agree that the development and use of the Property as proposed will provide a public benefit to the citizens of both municipalities;

WHEREAS, in light of such benefits, Sutton is willing to permit, and Northbridge is willing to allow, the connection of the Property to the Sutton Sewer System under the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement;

WHEREAS, to secure such a connection, Walmart is willing to abide by the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement;

WHEREAS, Sutton and Northbridge are authorized by General Laws Chapter 40, Sections 4 and 4A to enter into an Intermunicipal Agreement for the purpose of Sutton supplying wastewater treatment and disposal to property within the Town of Northbridge, subject to authorization by the Sutton Board of Selectmen and the Northbridge Board of Selectmen:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual benefits to be derived by the parties hereto, the parties agree as follows:

General Terms

1. Upon construction of the required facilities in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein, Northbridge agrees to permit connection of the Property to the Sutton Sewer System, and to collect from Walmart and remit to Sutton all fees and charges assessed by Sutton and incurred by Walmart for such connection and use as if the Property was served by the Northbridge Sewer System. No other Northbridge property

shall be allowed to tie into the Sutton Sewer System without a written agreement between the parties or a written amendment to this Agreement.

- 2. Walmart shall be responsible for and shall pay all costs associated with the design and construction of the connection of the Property to the Sutton Sewer System (the "Connection"), which Connection shall include all pipes and related facilities required to connect the Property to the Sutton Sewer System as that System is presently configured.
- 3. The Connection shall comply fully with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations. The maximum flow accepted by Sutton pursuant to this Agreement shall be a total of 25,000 gallons per day.
- 4. Walmart shall provide Sutton with all specifications and plans for said

 Connection, and the identity of those persons/entities that will construct the Connection,
 for approval by the Sutton Sewer Department prior to the commencement of any
 construction. Upon completion of construction, Walmart shall provide the Sutton Sewer

 Department with an as-built plan of the Connection as a condition precedent to the actual
 supply of service by Sutton.
- 5. Walmart shall provide and install a sewer meter of the type and specification required by the Sutton Sewer Department and in such location as shall be designated by the Sutton Sewer Department.
- 6. Walmart shall be responsible for obtaining all necessary permits, approvals and rights in real property required by federal, state and local law, rules and regulations for the excavation and construction in association with the Connection to the Property, and shall maintain same in full force and affect throughout the term of this Agreement.

- 7. Walmart shall notify Sutton upon completion of construction of the Connection and prior to any backfilling of the excavation to allow Sutton to inspect the Connection as constructed. A twenty-four (24) hour notice is required to schedule an inspection.
- Upon completion of the Connection, that portion of the Connection providing 8. service solely to the Property and located outside the bounds of any public way or property in which the Town of Sutton holds record rights for sewer purposes, together with such property rights as are necessary to allow for the construction and use of such portion (together, the "Walmart Connection"), shall be and remain the property of the owner of the Property, its successors and assigns, and said owner shall be responsible for, at its sole cost and expense, the maintenance and repair of the Walmart Connection in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Sutton Sewer Department, with the exception of any pump station constructed in order to provide sewer service to the Property ("Pump Station"), which shall be deeded by Walmart to the Town of Sutton together with a permanent easement to access said Pump Station, for nominal consideration (\$1.00). Walmart shall maintain the Walmart Connection, with the exception of the Pump Station, in compliance with all rules and regulations of Sutton and all applicable federal and state laws, rules and regulations, as they may be amended, and such further reasonable orders and requests as the Department may make to ensure proper operation of the Sutton Sewer System. Sutton reserves the right to inspect the Walmart Connection from time to time, to maintain and repair said connection if the owner fails to perform such work in a timely manner, and to make emergency repairs to said connection as necessary without prior notice to ensure proper operation of the Sutton Sewer System and protect public health and safety. The owner of the Walmart Connection shall be

responsible for the costs of all such maintenance and emergency repairs, with the exception of any maintenance or emergency repairs to the Pump Station, for which Sutton shall be solely responsible. These inspections and any inspections permitted under this Agreement may include any and all reasonable tests Sutton deems necessary. Northbridge and Walmart hereby consent to Sutton's entry onto or into the Town of Northbridge and the Property for the purpose of any inspection or repair, installation or maintenance which Sutton deems necessary under this Agreement.

- 9. Walmart shall pay to the Town of Sutton a one-time fee of \$25,000.00 for ongoing maintenance and repairs to the Pump Station. In addition to the payment to the Town of Sutton, Walmart shall make a mitigation payment in the amount of \$10,000.00 to the Town of Northbridge on account of the impacts that the construction and installation of the Connection will have on Northbridge.
- 10. To the extent required by the design for the Connection approved by the Sutton Sewer Department, Northbridge shall allow for the installation of underground pipes within the public ways of Northbridge in accordance with the terms and conditions of such permits as Northbridge may customarily and reasonably require to be issued for such use.
- 11. Subject to the terms and limits of this Agreement and of applicable state and federal law, Sutton, acting through its Sewer Department, will provide sewer service to the Property in consideration for payment of such connection and user rates or charges and fees (together "Charges") as such users of the Sutton Sewer System may lawfully be charged. Sutton shall provide an account of such Charges in its usual manner to Northbridge, which in turn shall issue an invoice to Walmart for payment of such

Charges and shall provide for the collection of such Charges as if the Property were served by the Northbridge Sewer System. Such collection shall include, without limitation, the exercise of those remedies provided under G.L. c.83, §§16A through 16F, and the collection through all available legal means of those uncollected Charges added to the taxes assessed against the Property, including the remedies provided by G.L. c.59 and 60. Upon collection of the Charges, and any penalty or interest accruing thereon, Northbridge shall promptly remit such amounts to Sutton.

- 12. Sutton shall use its best efforts to be at all times in compliance with any NPDES permit issued for the treatment facility and to comply with all state and federal laws, regulations, water quality standards, orders, decrees of any state and/or federal governmental authority having jurisdiction over the treatment and disposal of waste waters.
- 13. Characteristics of waste acceptable to Sutton by or from Northbridge shall at all times conform to standards set by Rules and Regulations of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (hereinafter called "EPA") and the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection ("DEP") and Sutton's Bylaws, all as issued and amended from time to time. No industrial waste or wastewater, as defined and regulated at 314 CMR 7.02 et seq., shall be accepted by Sutton pursuant to this Agreement.

Insurance

14. Walmart shall obtain and maintain during the period of construction of the Connection the following insurance coverage from companies licensed to do business in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and acceptable to Sutton and Northbridge. The amounts of such insurance shall be for each policy, not less than:

- (1) Bodily injury liability, including death \$1,000,000.00 on account of any one person and \$2,000,000.00 aggregate limit.
- (2) Property damage liability \$1,000,000.00 on account of any one accident, and \$2,000,000.00 aggregate.

All policies shall identify Sutton and Northbridge as an additional insured and shall provide that Sutton and Northbridge shall receive written notification at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of any amendment or cancellation. Walmart shall provide Sutton and Northbridge with appropriate certificate(s) of insurance or other evidence that it maintains insurance in the amounts required by this Agreement.

Failure to provide or to continue in force such insurance shall be deemed a material breach of this Agreement and may result in termination of sewer supply to the Property by Sutton.

Remedies

- 15. Sutton maintains the right to terminate the sewer service provided under this Agreement for any breach of the terms of this Agreement. Failure to cure any noncompliance within ten (10) days of written notice from Sutton of such noncompliance shall be considered a material breach of this Agreement and may result in termination of sewer supply to the Property by Sutton.
- 16. In the case of an emergency creating a threat to the public health or safety as determined by Sutton, Sutton may suspend or terminate sewer service to the Property immediately and without prior written notice. Written notice shall be provided as soon as practicable thereafter.
- 17. In addition to the remedies, power and authority which the Sewer Department has under any bylaws or regulations of Sutton, the following remedies apply:
 - a) If any party fails to fulfill any obligation or condition of this
 Agreement, the other parties have the right to terminate this Agreement by

giving ninety (90) days notice, in writing, of its intent to do so. Upon receipt of such notice the party shall have the right to prevent termination by curing the default within sixty (60) days. Termination shall not release Northbridge, or Walmart from their obligation to pay all bills or sums due in accordance with this Agreement.

- b) The parties reserve the right, either in law or equity, by suit, and complaint in the nature of mandamus, or other proceeding, to enforce or compel performance of any or all covenants herein.
- c) Once a bill remains unpaid past its due date, interest will be charged at the rate stated in the Sutton Bylaws or regulations from the due date to the date of payment of the bill.
- If an administrative agency, board, commission or division of the d) state or federal government or any court impairs, alters, restricts or limits, directly or indirectly. Sutton's rights, powers or authority to maintain, sell, contract for, or permit sewage disposal as described in this Agreement, Sutton in its sole discretion may terminate and void this Agreement by written notice to Northbridge and Walmart. Termination under this clause shall not release Northbridge or Walmart from its obligation to pay any sums due and all bills owed for services previously rendered unless to do so would be in violation of a final administrative or judicial decree, order or ruling. The notice of termination shall be given within five (5) business days after Sutton receives written notice of the action or decision of such agency, board, commission, division or court. It is the intent of this notice provision to give Northbridge and Walmart as much advance notice as possible consistent with Sutton's need to terminate. Sutton will notify Northbridge and Walmart of the formal institution of any proceedings or

the issuance of any formal order so that Northbridge, and Walmart may, if they choose, participate in such proceedings or challenge any such order.

- e) If Walmart fails to perform any obligation under this Agreement,
 Sutton may perform on behalf of Walmart and charge the reasonable costs
 thereof, including administrative time and attorneys' fees, to Walmart as a
 sum due under the Agreement provided written notice is given to Walmart
 allowing it a reasonable time to cure the default.
- f) Sutton may in its sole discretion immediately stop providing service to Northbridge and Walmart if Northbridge or Walmart fails to cure any default within sixty (60) days after written notice as provided in the previous paragraph.
- g) The remedies set forth in this Agreement are cumulative. The election of one does not preclude use of another, at any time or the same time.

Term of Agreement

18. The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of twenty-five (25) years from date hereof, unless sooner terminated as herein provided. The parties intend that they are the sole and exclusive beneficiaries of the Agreement.

Employees

19. Employees, servants, or agents of any party shall not be deemed to be agents, servants or employees of any other party for any purpose, including but not limited to either Workers' Compensation or unemployment insurance purposes.

Funding and Appropriations

20. Northbridge agrees to make available annually sufficient money to pay for its obligations under this Agreement, and shall give written notice that such funds are available and the amount of same.

User Fee

- 21. Sutton shall bill Northbridge on a semi-annual basis a user fee of \$295 based on 30,000 gallons. A fee of \$6.25 per every thousand gallons above the minimal usage (30,000 gallons) is applied. The user fees are subject to changes to said rate duly adopted by Sutton. The connection fees and user rate bylaws and regulations may be changed by Sutton at any time and Northbridge users will be subject to said changes.
- 22. As set forth infra, Sutton will bill Northbridge, and Northbridge shall bill Walmart for sewer service. Northbridge will reimburse Sutton for all sewer bills according to the applicable Sutton sewer rate schedule for non-Sutton residents and any amendments thereto.
- 23. Sutton may, in its sole discretion, surcharge Northbridge and Northbridge may surcharge Walmart for discharge of wastewater containing pollutant levels exceeding concentrations found in Normal Strength Wastewater in proportion to the actual strength to the maximum normal strength based upon BOD or suspended solids.

Review of Agreement

24. The parties will review and revise this Agreement to ensure compliance with the

United States Clean Water Act, 42 U.S.C. 1251 et seq. and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder as necessary, but at least once every three (3) years on a date to be determined by the parties.

Service of Notice

25. All notices or communications permitted or required by this Agreement must be in writing except in emergencies, and shall:

As to Sutton, be delivered or mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, to: Town Administrator, Sutton Town Hall, 4 Uxbridge Road, Sutton, MA 01590, and the Sutton Sewer Department, 4 Uxbridge Road, Sutton, MA 01590.

As to Northbridge, be delivered or mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, to: Town Administrator, Northbridge Town Hall, 7 Main Street, Whitinsville, MA 01588, and the office of the Department of Public Works, 11 Fletcher Street, .

Whitinsville, MA 01588.

As to Walmart, be delivered or mailed by certified mail, return receipt request, to:

Extension of Term

26. During the 23rd year of this Agreement, unless it is sooner terminated, the parties shall meet to negotiate in good faith for an extension or renewal of this Agreement subject to authorizations that may be required by then applicable law. This acknowledgment that the term of the Agreement, including any new terms or conditions, may be extended, does not impose on either party any express or implied obligations with regard to the potential negotiations or this Agreement. No party has any added or implied obligation to extend

or renew the terms of the Agreement with or without modifications.

Regulatory Authority

- 27: This Agreement is subject to the lawful rules, regulations, decisions, order or directives of any agency of the state and federal government with jurisdiction over the parties or subject matter of the Agreement. Any and all conditions, rules, regulations, orders or other requirements heretofore or hereafter placed upon Sutton or Northbridge by the EPA or by the Department of Environmental Protection or any other agency, division, office or department of the United States or the Commonwealth of Massachusetts or by any court of competent jurisdiction and by any other applicable Federal, state or county agency, shall be construed to become a part of this Agreement unless the Agreement is terminated hereunder. Further, any additional costs, including attorneys' fees, placed upon Sutton as a result of any orders of the above-referenced court or agencies in connection with the supplying of sewage disposal by Sutton to the Property shall be borne by Walmart.
- 28. All claims, disputes and other matters in question between the parties to this Agreement arising out of or relating to this Agreement or the breach thereof shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
- 29. This Agreement, including all documents incorporated herein by reference, constitutes the entire integrated agreement between the parties with respect to the matters described. This Agreement supersedes all prior agreements, negotiations and representations, either written or oral, and it shall not be modified or amended except by a written document executed by the parties hereto.

30.	This Agreement and each of its terms and conditions shall be binding upon all
succes	sors and assigns to the parties. Northbridge and Walmart shall notify Sutton in
writin	g of any successor or assign in right or interest to any of the parcels that make up
the Pro	operty.

31. If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby, and all other parts of this Agreement shall remain in force and affect.





Subject: Six Month Report

This is the summary of the fire department activity for the period of January 1, 2016 to June 30, 2016. The fire department responded to 475 fire emergencies, 1,011 ambulance emergencies, 36 non – emergency calls for service, visited the schools to conduct SAFE classes 16 times, and installed smoke and CO detectors in the homes of 10 senior citizens. In addition, the fire prevention activities accounted for 344 inspections, 301 permits issued, 6 fire drills, and the collection of \$11,240.00 in permit fees. Of the 1,011 ambulance calls, 853 required ALS services. The ambulance service collected \$367,620.00.

During this period we responded to 5 structure fires, 3 motor vehicle fires, and 40 outside fires. The fire losses to the affected properties will exceed \$350,000.00. We responded to fires in other communities 14 times under our mutual aid agreements and received mutual for fires and medical emergencies 59 times. The call fire and EMS payroll was \$65,856.11.

The new ambulance we ordered as a result of May 2015 Town Meeting should be arriving at our station by the end of this week. It will take a few days to get it in service; registered, radios installed and supplied, etc.

As part of our apparatus and equipment improvement program, I will, with the Boards permission be asking to purchase a new fire pumper at the October Town Meeting. The intention of the article will be to replace two (2), forty (40) year old vehicles with one dependable vehicle. This should help us to meet the ISO requirements and keep our rating.

We will be accepting applications for a firefighter / paramedic position and hope to have someone in place before September 1, 2016.

The annual fireworks display was held on July 8th. The original date was July 1st, however there was severe weather projected for that day and the decision to cancel was made early for safety reasons.

The fire department participated in the Community Service project – Whitinsville Serve – sponsored by the Pleasant Street Church. We had 4 different groups of young people from the U.S and Canada assisting with annual hose testing and routine maintenance projects at the stations.

DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS - DEPARTMENT UPDATE: "We continue to Get Things Done"

ADMINISTRATION - ENGINEERING - HIGHWAY:

- \$2.5M DPW Facility Project: Since my very 1st day on the job as Director of Public Works in August 2011 next to implementing a consistent "Roads Improvements Program" a new DPW Facility was on the "top-of-the-list". We are extremely excited to report that the May town meeting and town vote resulted in an "overwhelming yes". A BIG THANK YOU TO ALL THAT MADE THIS POSSIBLE. The BPCC is now "fast-tracking" the design-bid-construction effort with a tentative project completion timeline of Fall 2017. An Owner's Project Manager is now on board to assist in this process.
- "No Road Left Behind" Program (5th Year Currently Underway): Thanks to the town's commitment to provide dedicated road funds our roads continue to get better and safer. This year we earmarked \$692,000 of construction work and approximately 3-miles of road reconstruction is currently underway. These improvements are made possible by using the 5th and final year of town appropriated funds and Chapter 90 State Aid Funds. To maintain these pro-active "road improvement" efforts it is

our plan to request similar town appropriated funding at the 2017 Annual Spring Town Meeting. Highway Superintendent will elaborate on this program in greater detail as we continue to get things done.

- <u>"Sutton Street \$7.8M MassDOT Project</u>: The project is substantially complete. The remaining work includes punch list items such as the installation of missing street signs, shoulder-work, re-seeding, removal of fallen tree stumps, installation of plantings/trees and final clean-up. In addition to this work, the Town plans to perform miscellaneous repairs to the concrete bridge deck this construction season using both subcontract services and force-account staff.
- Church Street Corridor "MassWorks" Project: Our engineering consultant, CHA is currently performing drainage design, NOI preparation and environmental permitting tasks in advance for our application re-submittal for a MassWorks Grant. The estimated cost for this project is in the \$2.2M range. If approved this project will result in substantial roadway, drainage and traffic signalization improvements extending from just east of Plummer's Corner to the intersection of Quaker Street.
- ADA Crosswalk Accessibility Project(s): At the recommendation of the Safety Committee and in an effort to provide safe and accessibility crosswalks for our residents/pedestrians - ADA ramps/detectible pads were installed at the intersection of Forest Street/Main Street.
- <u>"Complete Streets" Program</u>: We are currently working closely with MassDOT and CMRCP through the "Complete Streets" program to provide safety and accessibility for all users of our roadways including pedestrians, motorists, bicyclists, etc. This program will provide up to \$50,000 in technical assistance and up to \$400,000 in construction funding for eligible communities/projects. A CMRPC Program Manager is scheduled to meet with the DPW later this week to look at tentative project candidates, namely Memorial Square, Plummer's Corner and the intersection of Sutton Street/Providence Road/School Street/ Upton Road.
- <u>Street Lights, Utility Poles & Double-Poles</u>: We continue to work closely with National Grid to eliminate double-poles. Most notably, the double-pole located at Benson Road/Providence Road was removed.
- During the 2nd week of July the "SERVE" Community Church Group under the leadership/coordination of Jack Crawford painted more than 50 town-owned fire hydrants (yellow/white) throughout the town namely, Highland Street, Cooper Road, Hill Street, and Alana Drive neighborhoods. In addition, this group At the Senior Center the entire parking lot was cleaned debris, planted flowers, washed windows, and

cleaned-up the basement at the Senior Center. They also picked-up litter at the DPW Facility/surrounding areas.

- <u>Senior Center</u>: We worked closely with the AAB and Senior Center Committee to improve egress/accessibility at the main entrance of the facility. Many thanks to Northbridge residents Bill Mello for his professional architectural/design assistance to develop "existing-conditions" and "proposed-work" and Disability Commission Member Bruce Frieswick for his coordination efforts to meet with the AAB. Improvements will include work at the entrance steps, handrails and pavement markings.
- MS4 Stormwater Permit: In April 2016, the EPA issued the final MS4 Stormwater Permit. It will be in effective 01 July 2017 and communities must submit their NOI by 29 September 2017.
- <u>2015 2016 SNOW & ICE PROGAM</u>: Our 1st snow & ice event began on December 29th and continued with a total of 45-inches and 12 Snow & Ice events. *Highway Superintendent will elaborate on this program in greater detail.*
- <u>Earth Removal</u>: Since October 2011, earth removal work at 130 Riverdale Street continues under permit extensions granted by the Earth Removal Board. Approximately 580,000 cubic yards of earth product has been removed since that time. The Earth Removal Board (Clerk) continues to monitor progress on a routine basis.

SEWER:

- Average WWTP flows for the 1st six calendar year months was 199MG (i.e. very similar to last season at 198MG).
- NPDES Permit: The WWTP continues to function well and all effluent values are within the new regulation limits total nitrogen (8 mg/l), total aluminum (87 ug/l) and phosphorus (0.20 mg/l).
- Twelve (12) new sewer connections were made since January 1st resulting in \$63,008 in revenue.
- Walmart- Town of Sutton Pump Station: Design and discussions are ongoing with the Town of Sutton, Walmart and their engineers to install a pump station and force-main tie-in to Sutton's sanitary sewer system which will service 100 Valley Parkway. Approximately 800-feet of 8-inch gravity sewer pipe will also be installed running west-bound from the proposed pump station for Northbridge residents.
- <u>Comprehensive Wastewater Management Plan (CWMP)</u>: As a result of our flow isolation tasks sub-areas no. 3 and 4 (i.e. downtown Linwood

neighborhoods) were identified as high-priority areas which required needed root removal and CCTV of 12,000 linear feet of our collection system. This work identified numerous structural deficiencies, joint separation, cracked pipe, manhole seepage, etc. The next steps include analyzing the data; perform value effective analysis, develop miniprojects and cost estimates; prepare construction bid specifications; and solicit bids. This will then lead into our "find-it" and "fix-it" program for these sub-areas.

WATER:

- <u>Eleven (11) new water connections</u> were made since January 1st resulting in \$16,500 in revenue.
- Fire Hydrant Painting: The Town of Northbridge water distribution system consists of approximately 380 public fire hydrants. In addition to those fire hydrants painted by the "SERVE" Group Eagle Scout Nathan Lamberson will lead a team to perform an "Eagle Scout" project to paint fire hydrants along the Providence Road "gate-way" and intersecting streets with a goal to paint approximately 100 fire hydrants. Many thanks to Nathan and his team in this effort and for "stepping-up-to-the-plate".
- Water Radio Transmitter Units: Whitinsville Water Company (WWC) has substantially completed the installation of their water meter radio transmitter units and the Town has commenced the installation of our 2,214 water meter radio transmitter units. The completion date for this work is September 2016. The installation of new water meters will follow closely behind.

RE: COMMUNITY PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT

January-July 2016 Report

Provided below is a summary brief of topics I plan to review during the Board of Selectmen meeting of Monday, July 18, 2016.

SUBDIVISIONS

The Planning Board continues to oversee the construction/completion of six (6) residential subdivisions: CAMELOT (located off Hill Street); CARPENTER ESTATES (located off Carpenter Road); HEMLOCK ESTATES (located off Sutton Street); LEONARDO ESTATES (located off Highland Street); PRESIDENTIAL FARMS (located off Hill Street); and SHINING ROCK GOLF COMMUNITY (located off School Street).

The Planning Board is currently in receipt of a preliminary plan (SUNRISE ESTATES) for subject property located off of Fowler Road and South Tessier Street. The proposed subdivision shows 72 single-family house lots to be located within the Residential-Three (R3) Zoning District, where the minimum lot size is 20,000 SF compared to 30,000 SF within the Residential-One (R1). The development proposes to extend water and sewer.

The submittal of a preliminary plan enables the subdivider, the Planning Board, municipal departments and owners of abutting properties to review subdivision and zoning requirements and discuss potential concerns before a definitive plan is prepared. The filing of a preliminary plan does not entitle the plan to be recorded at the Registry of Deeds nor secure approval of a definitive plan. Submittal of a preliminary plan followed within 7-months by a definitive "freezes" the zoning in effect with regard to the land for a period of 8-years from the date of the endorsement of definitive.

SITE PLAN DEVELOPMENTS

In June 2016, the Planning Board approved site development plan for a self-storage facility (8 buildings total) to be located off Douglas Road, opposite corners of Castle Hill Road; the Owner/Applicant shall work with the Planning Board in formalizing a landscaping design plan that compliments the town's designation within the Blackstone River Valley National Historical Park. Unfortunately due to their condition the majority of the existing trees along Douglas Road will likely be cut-down.

The Planning Board also approved the change of use for the Linwood Mill Complex allowing for a brewery to locate within the existing 2-story accessory building. The nano-brewery (Purgatory Brewery Company) will

include a 3-barrel system which will yield approximately 90-gallons a week. According to the Owner the brewery is planned to be opened 3-days a week.

The Planning Board continues to monitor the progress of the build-out of Osterman Commerce Park. The town plans to partner with the Developer once again this year for a *MassWorks Grant* for improvements to Church Street Extension and Quaker Street.

The site plan review application of the Main Street Commercial Property (-proposed 4,500SF retail with gas station, drive-thru and carwash) to be located off of Main Street and Water Street was withdrawn in June 2016. The Owner/Applicant plans to re-file later this year, addressing engineering comments, traffic/circulation, drainage and other concerns noted during the initial review.

ZONING BYLAW -AMENDMENTS

In certification received June 28, 2016 the Office of the Attorney General approved the zoning amendment articles of the 2016 Spring Annual Town Meeting.

SUBDIVISION RULES & REGULATIONS -AMENDMENTS

The town's Subdivision Rules & Regulations were amended in March 2016; amendments include increasing the minimum right-of-way of minor and secondary streets (40 to 50-feet), standards for cul-de-sacs, placement of street trees, and eliminating fire alarm systems (call-boxes).

SUTTON/NORTHBRIDGE SEWER EXTENSION (WALMART)

It is the understanding of the Planning Board that the Walmart facility located off Main Street intends to extend and connect to Sutton's municipal sanitary sewer system (via an Inter-Municipal Agreement). The Planning Board is encouraged that the sewer extension will create and allow for enhanced economic development opportunities in Northbridge.

CDBG-DR ROCKDALE YOUTH CENTER RELOCATION PROJECT

The Rockdale Youth Center Project continues to progress, with the majority of the renovations now complete (only punchlist items remain). The Whitin Community Center plans to move the RYC from its current Providence Road location to Church Ave by mid-August 2016. The former RYC will be razed during the month of August/September; the land will then be conveyed to the town at the Fall Annual Town Meeting.

OPEN SPACE & RECREATION PLAN

The Planning Board and Open Space & Recreation Plan Update Committee have been working with Beals + Thomas consultants in updating the town's OSRP. A public workshop is scheduled for <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>July 26</u>, <u>2016</u> <u>beginning at 6:00 PM in the Town Hall</u>. Attendees will review Goals & Objectives, Priority Action Items and other components of the OSRP. Those interested in learning more or assisting are encouraged to attend.

HOUSING PRODUCTION PLAN

The Planning Board has been working with Karen Sunnarborg, a housing & planning consultant to prepare a Housing Production Plan for the town. The HPP will provide the town with update to date demographic, market trends and identify local housing needs and strategies to address those needs. A Public Forum is scheduled for <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>August 23, 2016 (7:00PM –Town Hall)</u>. Board of Selectmen, town officials and other interested residents are encouraged to attend.

January-July 2016

The preparation of a Housing Production Plan shall be done in accordance with the Massachusetts Department of Housing & Community Development (DHCD) requirements under 760 CMR 56.03(4) and as required to meet Chapter 40B Comprehensive Permit requirements for affordable housing production in Massachusetts.

A Housing Production Plan (HPP) is a community's proactive strategy for planning and developing affordable housing by: creating a strategy to enable it to meet its affordable housing needs in a manner consistent with the Chapter 40B statute and regulations; and producing housing units in accordance with the HPP. The HPP regulation became effective on February 22, 2008 when the DHCD promulgated 760 CMR 56.00, Comprehensive Permit; Low or Moderate Income Housing. The HPP regulation is contained in 760 CMR 56.03(4). HPPs replace Planned Production under 760 CMR 31.07(1) (i). If a community has a DHCD approved HPP and is granted certification of compliance with the plan by DHCD, a decision by the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) relative to a comprehensive permit application will be deemed "consistent with local needs" under MGL Chapter 40B. "Consistent with local needs" means the ZBA's decision will be upheld by the Housing Appeals Committee.

MASTER PLAN (UPDATE)

The Planning Board may look to secure funding at the 2016 Fall Annual Town Meeting for the preparation of a Master Plan (last updated in 1994). Elements of a Master Plan includes: Goals & Policies; Land Use Plan; Housing; Economic Development; Natural & Cultural Resources; Open Space & Recreation; Services & Facilities; Circulation; and Implementation. Question(s) –What do we have or don't have? What do we want our community to be in the future? What are we willing to do to achieve it?

MHC GRANT -GREAT HALL RESTORATION PROJECT

The Town was one of 22 projects selected for this year's MA Preservation Projects Fund (Round 22) from the Massachusetts Historical Commission. The Great Hall Restoration Project includes flat plaster and decorative plaster repair and painting of the walls and ceiling. The amount of \$175,000.00 was approved at the 2016 Spring Annual Town Meeting, a matching-grant of \$50,000.00 was awarded to Northbridge.

IT GRANT

Northbridge was awarded a \$16,600.00 IT Grant from the State as part of its Community Compact Initiative. Grant funds will be used to purchase computers and other IT equipment for Planning, Conservation, and Building, as well as, the Board of Health.

BUSINESS BREAKFAST

On June 1st Northbridge in partnership with the Blackstone Valley Chamber of Commerce hosted a Business Breakfast at the Northbridge Memorial Town Hall. The event was well attended with approximately 50 participating in discussions on economic development opportunities and initiatives. Attendees heard from municipal staff, Senator Michael Moore, Senator Ryan Fattman and Representative David Muradian, as well as, representatives from the MA Office of Business Development and the MA Growth Capital Corporation on the various types of programs available to assist in job growth and business retention.

The Planning Board now consists of the following: Brian Massey, Chairman; Mark Key, Vice Chairman; Pamela Ferrara, Clerk; Harry Berkowitz, Member; James Berkowitz, Member; and Cynthia Key, Associate Member.

Subject: SERVE Projects

I am receiving oral reports from our eleven teams who are reporting their experiences and accomplishments on Day #1. I think you will find that these kids are task oriented. Initial indications are:

Northbridge DPW - they painted 30 fire hydrants in the first day - both colors.

Northbridge FD - they pulled and restacked hoses from two fire trucks for the department's annual inspection; then washed the floor at the Rockdale station and washed one fire truck;

Northbridge Senior Center - They weeded and did outside projects, plus cleaned up litter around the facility and along Highland Street & behind Shaw's Market;

DCR - They learned about the history of the heritage corridor by a park ranger at \$287 oak Street; Uxbridge, then went to the Millville Locks and cleaned trees and brush near the lock & transported them to a high point by the trail, filling a dump truck several times and completed their task before lunch & went on to do other chores.

Northbridge Retirement Home - They painted 56 sections of stockade fencing & are over 1/2 done.

Community Harvest Project - They worked harvesting numerous bushels of vegetables from the garden in Grafton for the food pantries in the area.

This is only what I have heard. They filled several bags of litter from the community in and around church street and turned in two hypodermic needles to the police department.

ZIKA VIRUS, MOSQUITO SURVEILLANCE & ABANDONED SWIMMING POOLS

We have all heard by now about the Zika virus, and Massachusetts has identified several travel-associated cases to date. But there has been no local transmission, and Mass. Public Health states that local transmission is "unlikely" at this time. In the endemic areas Zika has been found, 2 species of mosquito are currently implicated in transmission: Ae. aegypti and Ae. albopictus.

Ae. aegypti is not found in Massachusetts, and Ae. albopictus has only been found in a few locations. In New Bedford both eggs and adults have been found the past few seasons, and single collections of eggs were identified in our area last year in Worcester and Littleton. CMMCP has been actively trapping for this species the past several years, and we have added additional traps to monitor for this species, as well as augmenting our mosquito surveillance by adding ovitraps* to our program. Egg collections are brought to our office and eggs are counted, and then these collections are sent into the MDPH lab for rearing. If Ae. albopictus is identified, then surveillance will be intensified in the surrounding areas.

We have also been treating abandoned or unopened swimming pools. These areas can become excellent larval mosquito habitat, and we have a specific program to reduce their emergence by using long term, slow release bacterial products. Please notify our office of these areas by phone, fax or e-mail. Residents can contact us directly, and any application we perform will not harm the pool if there are plans to open it in the future.

Please do not hesitate to contact our office at any time with concerns or questions about mosquito control, mosquito-borne diseases or the products and procedures we utilize to reduce risk from mosquitoes.

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*Special cups called "ovitraps" are placed in areas to collect container species. The cups have water inside about halfway up, and are lined with seed germination paper to give the female mosquito a substrate to lay her eggs upon.




