### Why Join the WCSA?

Our organization meets 4 times per year. Member towns send one member of their board to partake in our meetings. Meeting topics include local and state guests who address the organization with information and tools municipal leaders can use to better their towns. Every meeting has a section that allows for a "round table discussion" where members can discuss challenges facing their communities without having to worry about any open meeting law violations (we are a private entity, not a public body). Meetings typically take place on Thursday evenings at 6:30, and food is provided. WCSA meetings provide a valuable networking tool to allow you to meet selectmen from other towns. Furthermore the WCSA advocates on behalf of towns for, or against causes throughout the commonwealth. Meeting locations are rotated to allow variation in the driving distance for members. Any current members are encouraged to host meetings in their towns. Membership is good for one year.

## **WCSA History**

The Worcester County Selectmen's Association was founded in Gardner on July 7<sup>th</sup> 1920. The mission was to unite select boards throughout Worcester County to encourage the sharing of ideas and the betterment of the commonwealth. The WCSA was the first organization of its kind and has undergone many changes. After a brief hiatus, the association was revived in 2013 and membership includes almost half of the 60 cities and towns in Worcester County.

## **Past Speakers and topics**

The WCSA has had a variety of speakers, all of whom have had a great deal to share with the association. Here are some examples:

<u>Sheriff Lew Evangilidis</u>- Sheriff Evangilidis was happy to put on a presentation showcasing the programs the Sheriff's office offers to communities. Some of these programs include Face 2 Face (youth drug prevention), TRIAD (senior citizen safety training), and the southern Worcester County Resource Center.

<u>District Attorney Joe Early</u>- District Attorney Early explained to the WCSA how the DA's office is about more than putting people behind bars. He said how his office is very involved in community service and public safety. His office has offered education on problems such as distracted driving, drug abuse and more.

Southern Worcester County Communications Center Director Greg Lynskey-Mr. Lynskey is the Director of the SWCCC, which is located in Webster. The SWCCC is a new facility that provides regional dispatch services to the towns of Webster and Dudley, with enough capacity for five towns. Mr. Lynskey explained the regional dispatch model, and how it can be beneficial to a town's budget by regionalizing their dispatch services to accommodate the new state 911 requirements.

<u>Worcester Regional Chamber of Commerce President Tim Murray</u>- Mr. Murray, who is the former Lt. Governor, explained how important it is for Worcester County to work together to compete with the likes of Boston and Metro-West. Worceter County is seeing grown in technology and pharmaceutical sectors thanks to the abundance of colleges. He also talked about the advantages of the Worcester Regional Chamber of Commerce.







## Highlights from the TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE

For the period July – December 2015

### 1. Pine Grove Cemetery:

- Linda and I continue to enjoy this new responsibility, which includes sales, customer service, deed preparation, and record keeping.
- I am happy to report that together, the DPW and Town Clerk's office have developed an efficient system in regards to handling sales, preparing and recording deeds, and general record keeping. (Pine Grove Cemetery staff did a great job of record keeping, but we needed to create our own.)

### 2. Elections:

- The Board of Registrars met in August and voted to accept the list of election workers that was provided by the Town Clerk's Office.
- Linda and I spent several weeks in October and November certifying names on the 19 Initiative Petitions that were circulating throughout the Commonwealth this fall.
- 2016 will be a busy election year the attached insert has been included in our outgoing mail since October (we print three on a sheet to save paper and to not increase postage on the outgoing mail).
- The 2016 election information, voter registration forms, and absentee ballot applications were mailed to the nursing homes in Town and hand-delivered to the Senior Center recently.

### 3. 2016 Annual Town Census:

• Started preparation in November for early January mailing.

### 4. Code update:

 Update #15 was done. This update includes Town Meeting action from the 2013 Fall Annual Town Meeting through the 2015 Spring Annual Town Meeting, plus some amendments to the Board of Health Code. The updates will be distributed to departments and put online shortly.

### 5. Continuing Education:

- Linda and I attended the Worcester County Clerks conference in August and the Mass Clerks conference in October.
- In July, Linda completed her second year of a three-year, week-long program for credits toward her Certified Municipal Clerk (CMC) designation.
- I started pursuing my Master Municipal Clerk designation (MMC) by taking one of the online courses offered for this designation.
   Comments: The Certified Municipal Clerk (CMC) and the Master Municipal Clerk (MMC) programs are the two professional designations through the International Institute of Municipal Clerks. They are achieved through a points system.
- 6. Annual distribution of the Summary of the Conflict of Interest Law:
  - In September, as required by law, we distributed a copy of the Summary of the Conflict of Interest Law to all employees and board and committee members along with instructions for acknowledging receipt.
  - Acknowledgments received by us are time-stamped, logged, and filed alphabetically.

### HOUSING - Matthew Armendo, Health Agent

- The office received 17 requests for inspections of dwelling units by occupants. Complaints included insufficient or non-working heating systems, growth of mold-like substances, as well as insect infestations.
- The office also investigated 12 nuisance complaints typically trash or debris left on side of road or accumulating on a property.

The 45-day and 6-month quarantines are issued when a domestic animal is treated for a "wound of unknown origin". If they are current on their rabies vaccinations, the animal is immediately boostered and a 45-day in-home quarantine is issued. If the animal is not currently vaccinated against rabies, a 6-month quarantine is required.

Compost bins are still available in the Board of Health office - \$30. The bins were purchased with grant funds. There are just 16 left.


### West Nile Virus (WNV) and Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE)

As you may recall, on September 23<sup>rd</sup>, the Town received notice from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health that a mosquito tested positive for West Nile Virus. Central Mass Mosquito Control Project (CMMCP) was contacted and the affected area was sprayed. (behind Varky's, Church Street)

On October 1st, we had the first EEE positive mosquito in the State. Again, CMMCP was contacted and the affected area was sprayed. (Driscoll's Lane)





### TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT - December 21, 2015

- 1) Evergreen Center / Wreath Presentation The Town has received the annual wreath, which was presented by Olivia Stone an Evergreen client and her mentor, Barbara Edwards. The wreath will be hung outside during the Holiday Season.
- 2) <u>Municipal Aggregation Program Update</u> The Aggregation Program is moving forward. We plan on advertising information about the program again in local papers. Individuals who have questions can contact the Town Manager's Office or Con Edison directly.
- 3) Water Meter Replacement Program The Whitinsville Water Company has installed approximately half of the water meters and radio transmitters for their customers. The DPW Director has received bids to install transmitters on the Northbridge Water customers, which he plans on moving forward with after the first of the year.
- 4) <u>Sutton Street Project Update</u> The structures have been lowered in the streets and the paving of driveway aprons has been completed. Construction on the sewer inserts should be completed soon to allow hookups.
- 5) <u>DPW Facility Update</u> The Building Planning and Construction Committee has hired Cardinal Construction to oversee cost estimates and the scope of work for the proposed DPW site project, which is to be prepared for the Spring Town Meeting.
- 6) New Fire Truck Update The new ladder truck has been delivered and training is currently ongoing. Wal-Mart will be hosting a Public Safety Day on Tuesday, December 29<sup>th</sup> at 11 AM in the Wal-Mart parking lot, to allow individuals to view the new truck.
