




2. Please indicate the number of years you have lived in town:


3. Please indicate your age group:


4. How many persons live in your household?


5. How many children (<18 years of age) live in your househould?


6. Which best describes you?




7. How often do you or a member of your household use town playgrounds/recreational facilities? 286 responses




8. How would you rate Northbridge's playground and recreation facilities? ²⁸⁶ responses



9. Are you satisfied with the recreational opportunities offered in Northbridge? ²⁸⁰ responses




10. Does Northbridge have an adequate number of these facilities?




11. Please indicate your "Top 10 Recreational Facilities" you feel are needed or should be expanded in Northbridge:


12. How important is it to you that Northbridge allocate additional town funds (\$) to enhance/maintain existing recreational facilities?



13. How often do you or a member of your household use town open space? ²⁸⁶ responses




14. Are you satisfied with the amount of open space preserved in Northbridge? 282 responses




15. How familiar are you with the open space & conservation areas currently accessible in Northbridge?




16. How important is it to you that Northbridge utilize town funds (\$) to acquire additional open space?




17. How important is it to you that Northbridge preserve & acquired open space/conservation land? $285\,{\rm responses}$




18. Are you interested in the town preserving environmentally sensitive, natural habitat & water supply areas?




19. Would you support spending town funds (\$) to cleanup and/or improve access to rivers, lakes or ponds?




20. Do you currently utilize any of the town's rivers, lakes or ponds for the following? $^{\rm 284\,responses}$




21. How important is it to you that Northbridge allocate additional town funds (\$) to protect ecologically important resource areas?


22. Which of the following open space do you use?




23. How important is it to you that Northbridge allocate additional town funds (\$) to enhance/maintain/expand its open space/conservation land?




24. Which open space/recreational facilities in town do you and/or household currently use? ²⁶⁶ responses



25. Please indicate your "Top 5" priorities for open space & conservation land. 286 responses




26. Are familiar with the Community Preservation Act, commonly referred to as CPA funds? ²⁸⁴ responses




Northbridge adopted the Community Preservation Act (CPA) at the November 2017 General Election: adding a 1% surcharge on all real estate property tax bills. Proceeds of the CPA funds collected are deposited into special municipal accounts for Community Housing; Historic Resources; and Open Space & Recreation. CPA funds may be used to acquire, create, preserve OPEN SPACE; acquire, rehabilitate, preserve HISTORIC RESOURCES; acquire, create, preserve, support COMMUNITY HOUSING; and acquire, create, rehabilitate, land for RECREATIONAL USE.


