RE: (FY2020) CDBG -COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT Public Hearing (December 19, 2022)

Arrangements have been made for the Board of Selectmen to hold a Public Hearing Monday, December 19, 2022 to 1.) review/report on the status of the FY2020 Community Development Fund (Grant) awarded to Northbridge and 2.) consider re-allocation of available FY2020 funds to prepare construction documents (engineering plans) for roadway and infrastructure improvements to Church Avenue (w/in the SBI Target Area of Rockdale).

During the hearing Wayne Darragh, Community Opportunities Group, Inc. (Consultant) will review overall status of the town's CDBG program, which includes a town-wide Housing Rehabilitation Program and Slum & Blight Inventory Reports for two (2) Target Areas in Northbridge: New Village and Rockdale neighborhoods.

The Northbridge Housing Rehab Program (NHRP) offers income eligible property owners with up to \$40K in CDBG funding (15-year deferred payment loan at 0% interest) for home improvements; including code violations, substandard housing conditions and emergency repairs (leaking roof, failed heating system, septic, etc.). The NHRP remains ongoing with a recent surge in applications as a result of informational mailing sent to property owners. Northbridge has approximately \$410,000.00 remaining in its housing rehab fund and anticipates this balance to be fully committed within the next few weeks once applicants are income qualified, scopes of work are identified and projects are under contract.


The Slum & Blight Inventory Reports (New Village & Rockdale neighborhoods) have been completed, where in a vote taken June 13, 2022, the Board of Selectmen certified the two (2) Target Areas in disrepair with recognizable and patterns of disinvestment and meeting the Commonwealth's definition of substandard, blighted, or decadent areas. The SBIs includes analysis of existing physical conditions of public/private buildings and infrastructure. Northbridge is still awaiting review and approval from DHCD -Department of Housing & Community Development at this time.

Again, the term "slum & blight" is not one of local choice but a requirement of the State and federal agencies, where an approved SBI creates opportunity for future CDBG funds to assist in revitalizing a targeted area. To that end, and with the SBI reports completed under budget, Northbridge may seek to re-allocate available CDBG funds to prepare roadway/infrastructure improvement plans. At project closeout for the Slum & Blight Inventory reports, the town had a balance of approximately \$63,000.00 in uncommitted and undesignated FY2020 CDBG funds, which could be repurposed for design/construction plans for Church Avenue located within the Rockdale neighborhood Target Area.

The accompanying handout includes excerpts from the Rockdale Slum & Blight Inventory report, along with a summary brief on general conditions of Church Avenue, photographs, and recommendations from the Director of Public Works. It is anticipated Church Avenue improvements would be completed in phases, where the town may seek supplemental CDBG funds for construction.

ROCKDALE (SBI -TARGET AREA)


Roadway -Church Avenue, located off School Street is a ±3,200 Linear-Foot roadway with water/sewer/drainage/gas utilities. This secondary arterial roadway services a densely populated section of Rockdale with a steady presence of cut-through traffic to avoid a 5-way intersection at Rt 122/Providence Road & Sutton Street. The Church Avenue neighborhood consists of multi-family dwellings on one end and transitions to single-family homes on the other. The town's Rockdale Playground, Oliver Ashton Little League ballfields and Legion Field are located off Church Avenue; where many residents of the area may walk to, in addition to the commercial-retail businesses located downtown (Rockdale -Providence Road) including Cumberland Farms, Northbridge House of Pizza, & Gary's Variety. *Overall, the condition of Church Avenue is degraded and may be considered POOR, with many sections in structural failure; evidence of cracking, pot holes, depressions, & rutting. DPW spends a considerable amount time (& money) filling pot holes and repaving small sections of the travelway as needed. According to the DPW Director, a full-depth reclamation (2-inch base & 2-inch final asphalt) is needed for Church Avenue; this would allow for necessary changes in grading to help drainage.*

Sidewalk -Church Avenue has sidewalks along both sides of the travelway extending from School Street easterly to the Taft Street intersection (roughly a third of the way down the road). The sidewalk terminates prior the Rockdale Playground. Many sections of the sidewalk are cracked, sinking; with some areas below the top grade of the roadway, resulting in seasonal drainage and icing issues. Segments of the sidewalk are narrow and lack ADA ramps at crosswalk locations; this deficiency may be noted in the recently completed town-wide ADA Self-Assessment Transition Plan. *DPW Director recommends as part of a full-depth reclamation project for Church Avenue the existing sidewalk be removed & replaced, adding ADA ramps & panels, as well as extending the sidewalk along the southwesterly-side through to the Rockdale Playground (approximately 520-feet).*

Drainage -existing drainage system on Church Avenue is outdated, undersized and ineffective; resulting in standing water at intersections and along gutter lines. Many of the catch basins (16 total) are located within the travelway as opposed to the gutter line, where stormwater can be captured and treated. *DPW Director recommends installation of a new trunkline, capable of handling the hydraulic flows of the area.*

Water/Sewer/Gas -public infrastructure within Church Avenue includes municipal sewer & public water; portions of the sewer main, divided into 2 sections may date back to 1922, consisting of 6 to 8-inch clay pipe. According to the DPW Director, the northerly section extending from School Street to Plantation Street has many service calls for blockage the last several years. Many of the sewer manholes are broken and/or paved over. *Sewer Superintendent recommends a complete upgrade of the sewer main with 8-inch PVC, with all frames and current replaced with standard structures.* DPW to review condition of water main with Whitinsville Water Company.





- <u>Wednesday, December 7, 2022</u> Conference Call with the architect for the NES Feasibility Study to discuss planning for a community forum in January.
- <u>Wednesday, December 7, 2022</u> Met with Heather Elster and staff from Mass Development to talk about Whitin Community Center/Town ARPA projects.
- <u>Thursday, December 8, 2022</u> Attended the virtual EACC Meeting to support the TIF application for Eyepoint Pharmaceuticals.
- <u>Thursday, December 8, 2022</u> Attended the weekly Fire Station Construction Ste Visit.

- 2. <u>Fire Station Project</u>: Weekly design team meetings continue to occur every Monday morning and weekly construction meetings every Thursday afternoon with the project team, the GC M. O'Connor, and the site contractor Leahy. The GC completed paving the binder coat last week. They are preparing to frame (wood) the outbuilding and expect to begin erecting steel on the main building at the end of the month. The Design Team continues to work through bidding questions/change order clarifications. The BPCC met this past week on 12/13/2022.
- 3. Northbridge Elementary School Reuse Study: The architect team from Abacus is currently developing a public meeting presentation for January. The surveyor has completed the field work and we are awaiting the existing conditions plan. The DEP Phase I study has been completed by the consultant Langan Environmental who attended the BPCC Meeting this past week on 12/13/2022 meeting to discuss the need for a Phase II.
- 4. <u>Linwood Basketball Courts Project</u>: The field survey has been completed by Activitas, the site engineer. The Town Manager, the DPW Director and Activitas have met with the Parks and Recreation to discuss design programming. The DPW will be assisting with suitable soil testing for the light bases under the direction of Activitas. Activitas is also working on bid documents in anticipation of bidding the project in early 2023.
- <u>FY2024 Budget and Capital Development</u>: Planning for next year's budget is underway. The Town Manager is working on preliminary revenues and available capital funds in preparation for Budget Development during the upcoming winter. Staff assignments have been distributed with budget/capital submissions and are due Friday, January 13, 2023.
- 6. <u>Cable Advisory Committee</u>: The Town Manager has been working with the Committee to develop needs for the next Franchise Agreement with Charter Communications. The Town Manager is also working with Attorney Bill Hewig from KP Law to plan for a public hearing to be held in January 2023.
