Voting in the Presidential Primary on March 3, 2020

 If a voter is enrolled in a political party, they may only vote in that party's primary.

For example, if a voter is registered as a Democrat, they may only receive a Democratic ballot, or if a voter is registered as a Republican, they may only receive a Republican ballot.

- An Unenrolled voter, commonly referred to as "independent," and members of political designations may vote in any primary. When appearing at the check-in, the voter must declare which party ballot they want to receive.
 - Choosing to vote in a party's primary does NOT enroll a voter as a member of that party.
 - Once an unenrolled voter or a member of a political designation makes their choice of what party ballot they want to vote on, they CANNOT get a ballot for another party.
- There are currently four political parties: Democratic, Republican, Green-Rainbow, and Libertarian.
